

Cookies Policy

1. When the User uses the Service, VarsoviaFX may use cookies and other storage and access technologies and may automatically collect certain technical information about the User's device and use of the Service. Further information about the processing of personal data is available in the Privacy Notice.
2. Cookies are small text files or similar data stored on, or accessed from, the User's device when the Service is used. For the purposes of this Policy, references to cookies also include, where applicable, other storage and access technologies, such as web storage, pixels, scripts, tags and similar technologies that store information on, or access information from, a User's device.
3. The entity responsible for placing or accessing cookies and other storage and access technologies through the Service is the website owner - **VarsoviaFX LTD** - whose contact details are available in the 'Contact' section.
4. Cookies and other storage and access technologies may be used for the following purposes:
 - a. enabling the operation of the Service and the provision of services requested by the User, including authentication, maintaining a User's session and remembering information entered or selections made during use of the Service;
 - b. protecting the Service and Users, including preventing or detecting fraud, misuse, unauthorised access and technical faults;
 - c. remembering User-selected preferences and adapting the appearance or functionality of the Service to the User's device or preferences;
 - d. collecting statistical information about how the Service and its website are used, with a view to understanding usage and improving their structure, content, performance and usability.
5. Two basic types of cookies and similar technologies may be used within the Service: 'session' and 'persistent'. Session technologies generally remain active only for the duration of the User's visit or browser session. Persistent technologies remain on the User's device for a defined period or until they are deleted by the User.
6. Under the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003 (PECR), storing information on, or accessing information from, a User's device generally requires the User to be provided with clear and comprehensive information and, where required, to give prior consent. Consent is not required where a relevant PECR exception applies and its conditions are met, including:
 - a. storage or access used solely for the transmission of a communication over an electronic communications network;
 - b. storage or access that is strictly necessary to provide an information society service requested by the User, including where necessary for security, fraud prevention, authentication or maintaining information entered by the User;
 - c. storage or access used solely to collect statistical information about how the Service or website is used in order to improve it, provided the applicable conditions are met, including providing clear information and a simple, free means of objecting;
 - d. storage or access used to adapt or enhance the appearance or functionality of the Service in line with the User's preferences, provided the applicable conditions are met, including providing clear information and a simple, free means of objecting.
7. Where consent is required, non-exempt cookies or other storage and access technologies will not be used until the User has made an affirmative choice. The User may accept, reject or manage optional technologies through the Service's cookie consent mechanism. Consent may be withdrawn or changed at any time with the same ease with which it was given. Where VarsoviaFX relies on the statistical purposes or appearance/functionality exception, the User may object through the same settings free of charge.

8. Detailed information about the cookies and other storage and access technologies currently used by the Service, including their provider, purpose and duration, and whether a third party is involved, is made available through the Cookie Settings within the Service. This information is reviewed and updated when the technologies used by the Service change.
9. Some cookies or other storage and access technologies may be provided by third parties whose services are used in connection with the Service. Where third-party technologies are used, the relevant third party, purpose and duration are identified in the Cookie Settings. Where a third party processes information for its own purposes, its own privacy information may also apply.
10. The User may also use browser or device settings to delete or restrict cookies and similar technologies. Browser or device controls are an additional means of managing these technologies and may not provide the same choices as the Service's cookie controls. Restricting certain technologies may affect some functionality available within the Service.
11. VarsoviaFX reviews this Policy periodically and may update it to reflect changes in the technologies used by the Service, legal requirements or regulatory guidance. The current version of this Policy is made available through the Service.

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
